The members of VC Revolution have decided to name this and future ERRL road race promotions in memory of our friend and fellow cyclist Ken Wright.

Ken started cycling after joining the West Suffolk Wheelers in Bury St Edmunds in 1964. This was the start of a lifelong love of cycling and Ken became one of their star riders, breaking many time-trialling records. In 1969 Ken joined the newly-formed Velo Club Anglia Sport, which took road racing as the main discipline and it was this form of cycling which Ken enjoyed. In 1972 Ken returned to the West Suffolk Wheelers and continued to enjoy more success in time-trialling and road racing.

In 1974 Ken and wife Pam emigrated to South Africa where a whole new world of cycling opened up to Ken – track racing. This was the predominant part of cycling in South Africa and an aspect of the sport where Ken excelled with his attendance at meetings in Johannesburg and Pretoria.

The family returned to the UK in 1979 and Ken joined Ratae RC in Leicester – once again enjoying track racing. When Ken moved to Colchester he joined Colchester Rovers and then the reformed Angliasport, once again enjoying road racing, time trialling and track racing.

Ken enjoyed a lifetime of cycling, both as a competitor and spectator and was a real club-man, always willing to promote events and coach youngsters, with former World Pursuit Champion Colin Sturgess being an early student and Ken's son David progressing to be a very good rider.

On behalf of Pam, David and Louise Wright we are proud to present the Ken Wright Memorial RR; a great testament to a gent who was a true cyclist

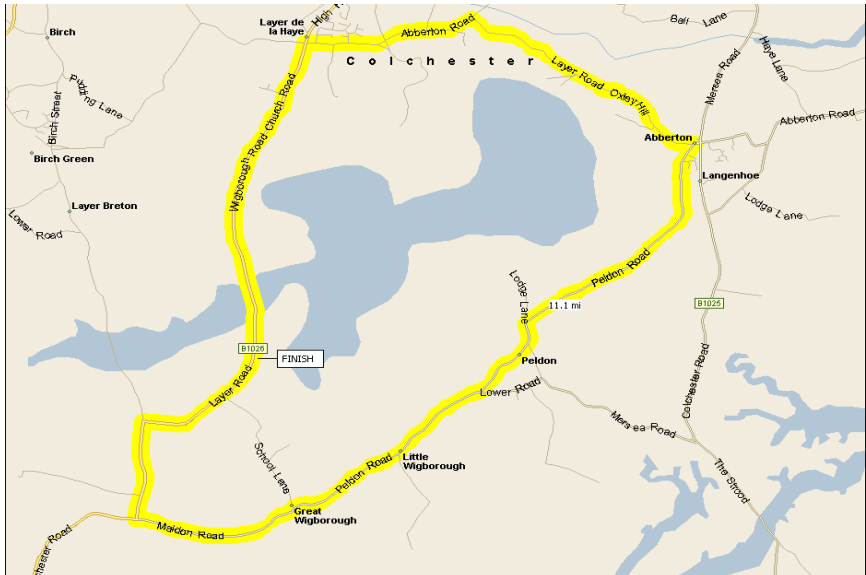

From the Layer Fox head straight down the hill and across the reservoir, once you have reached the concrete road this will be where the start finish line will be. Continue on and bear left at the junction and go down to the left turn at Wigborough. Once on the road continue to Peldon where you bear left through the village of Peldon and on to Abberton Village. In Abberton turn left and continue to the Layer Crossroads, once there turn left.

Notes to Riders:

- Signing on will close (at 8.30am) 5 minutes before the start.
- Rider briefing in HQ at 8.40am. **All riders must be present.**
- No helmet = No Ride
- No Licence = Day Licence.
- Any feeding must take place on the left hand side of the road.
- Neutral Service will be on the left hand side of the road only
- Riders more than 5 minutes behind the leading riders may be withdrawn.
- Please be considerate to local residents and all other road users.
- **Great care** needed on narrow section from Abberton to Layer and on reservoir, where wildfowl may be crossing the road.
- **Please also be aware of horses whilst the race is on.**
- No unauthorised following vehicles will be tolerated
- **Keep left of the central white lines at all times. Failure to comply may instigate your removal from the race.**
- First Aid Service will be provided. Any riders needing hospital treatment will be taken to Colchester General Hospital, Turner Road, Colchester. (Tel: 01206-747474).
- Please obey all Race Marshals instructions where given.
- Any littering or urinating in the public area will equal disqualification.
- Riders must obey the Highway Code.
- Maximum gear for juniors is 7.93m
